<p>This is the percentage of students entering the institution as full-time, first-time (no prior postsecondary education), degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students who entered in the Summer and Fall 2010 academic terms, and who completed their programs within 150 percent of normal time to completion. Disaggregated graduation rate data displayed by gender, race/ethnicity, and financial aid status are based on the same cohort of students. Because many of our students have previous college experience, the number of students measured in this rate is relatively small as compared to the total campus population.</p> <p>This campus began operations in 2017 and therefore was not required to report this data in the 2016 – 2017 IPEDS Graduation Rates Survey.</p> <p>The graduation rate reported for Broadview University’s main campus, Broadview University – West Jordan, was <b>39%</b>. The Retention Rate for Broadview University’s main campus, Broadview University – West Jordan, was <b>25%</b>, as reported in the 2016 – 2017 IPEDS Fall Enrollment Survey.
